3289/1985 REPORTS OF THE COUNTY COUNCILLOR AND CITY COUNCILLORS.

Sue Tyldesley - LCityC came top in the country for action on Climate Emergency. Changes coming in connection with food waste collection, no detail yet. Budget to be set soon, very challenging with the housing situation, including housing of refugees.

1) Meadows Close Issues

The approach road hedge (which obstructed ambulance access) has been dealt with amicably.

One bungalow has a wasp nest at the back -- and the long hedge bounding the back gardens needs clipping. I've asked Will Griffith of Environment to ask his team to attend to these.

2) Household Support Funding available for residents in need

Residents experiencing financial hardship can still apply for help from the Government's Household Support Fund (HSF) to pay for essential living costs.

The **Household Support Fund** aims to help with short-term living costs and pay for essential items such as food, energy and water bills or important household appliances such as fridges and cookers.

To be eligible to apply for help from the scheme, applicants must be aged 16 years and over, live in the Lancaster district and be able to demonstrate that they are struggling to afford such necessities or to pay their bills. Applicants also need to be willing to engage with Citizens' Advice for longer term support.

3) Grants for Disabled Residents

The council's *Home Improvement Agency* is currently promoting the availability of government grants to help residents remain living independently, warm, and safe. Disabled Facilities Grants can help anyone with mental health conditions, physical and learning disabilities, cognitive impairments, and those suffering from age-related disabilities. The grants can fund a wide range of home adaptations and the Home Improvement Agency will help residents through the whole process from initial enquiry to the completion of the work in their home. In addition there is a Handyperson Service for small repair jobs.
