The AGM for the village hall was held on the 22nd Nov, and was well attended, with 18 people present. Gerry Moore as chair summarised the Coffee @ St. John's. activities over the last year, during which time we had very largely got back to the pre-covid usage level. Mike Macklin as treasurer reported that thanks to continued sunshine in Yealand and our solar panels, together with a small grant from the city council, our finances were in good order, with reserves at a healthy level. We would need to put Knit and Natter meets on the second Wednesday charges up however, as fuel bills would be rising of the month at 2pm at St John's. sharply soon.

Upcoming expenses were needed to repair the leak in the roof, seemingly caused by fitting the solar panels some years ago, new signage and removal of an unstable tree in the car park.

The idea of an electric car charging point at the village hall was considered again, it would be of most use to visitors to Yealand, and particularly Congratulations to the 50/50 Club winners in hall users.
