B4RN Voice

Many in Yealand are connected to the B4RN fibre network, and when this was installed, if you wanted to retain a landline, you had to have a contract with another provider, such as vonage, to run the phone signal down the B4RN fibre.

That meant another contract, another small box of electronics, and another device needing a power supply. Relatively recently B4RN launched their own version of this, and your editor can report that it was a very simple conversion, simplification of the wiring and a modest cost saving. You can also divert calls and for no extra charge, but with another app, pick up landline calls on your mobile, a feature that was guite expensive on vonage.
