King Charles III England Coastal Path

This is being built inch by inch around the whole of England, and proposals for the section from Silverdale to Cleveleys, Blackpool were put out for consultation back in 2012! . After a period with little evidence of progress, a busy minister took time out of her holiday this July to approve the negotiated design details for the section near us.

The website now declares 'work to establish the route is now taking place.' Locals have walked for years, from Jenny Brown's Point across to the muddy track at Quaker's Stang which goes under the railway and gives access to the saltmarsh sections of Leighton Moss. With increased use, it looks as though this section may be fenced in. New stiles and signage will appear. See picture.

A new section is needed between Scout Crag chalet park and the end of Sands Lane, away from the road, and this seems to follow the railway. The rest of the route to Heysham very largely exists already. Going the other way the sections from Arnside to Greenodd are still in the 'yet to be determined' pile. What we really need now is someone to fund the route across the Arnside viaduct and on to Grange. Watch this space....

Foodbank

Morecambe Bay Foodbank, operating from a base in White Lund delivers emergency foodboxes across the whole Lancaster City area. They have funds to buy some in, but depend heavily on donations. They also get short dated fruit and veg from supermarkets, but the supplies are very unpredictable. Bread is bought in.

They also work with Egg Cup, a Lancaster based charity which takes surplus food from commercial sources, and supplies it on a heavily subsidised basis to those facing hardship.

We are having a collection on Saturday morning, October 28th, at the village hall. **Please bring non perishable foods between 9am and 1pm.**

Regular boxes contain tinned baked beans, tinned vegetables, tinned meat, tinned fruit, potatoes tinned and instant mash, pasta, rice, instant noodles, soup, long life milk and fruit juice, tea, biscuits. They can provide boxes for vegetarians, and babies, and also supply basic toiletries.
