#### **Yealand School News**

In the last few weeks, there's been a buzz at Yealand Church of England Primary School as we prepare our Year 4 and 5 children for a Lancashire Storytelling competition.

Through Mrs Berry's application, we were one of five schools selected to take part this year. The children have been introduced to a Scottish folklore tale and have to create their own story for performance which they will showcase in front of a panel of judges and then to an audience at a theatre in Chorley in April. We are all very excited about this opportunity for our children to shine.

To support this work, we have planned activities throughout the whole school to develop essential Speaking and Listening (oracy) skills. Since the pandemic, there has been a national decrease in these skills and we are working hard in school to support our children and their families, providing children with opportunities for their communication skills to flourish. We welcomed Dominic Kelly who shared his stories and taught the children techniques to be expressive and to connect with an audience. We also welcomed a local children's author Emily Fell, who shared her story 'The Snotgoblin' with the children and talked

about the creativity and excitement of developing stories. Both classes will have the opportunity to visit the theatre in the next few months. Our youngest children are going to see the story 'Pirates love Underpants' come alive at Lancaster Grand Theatre and our older children will experience the RSC Young Encounters production of an abridged version of 'The Tempest' at Blackpool Grand Theatre - including a question and answer session before and after the production.
