### First Aid Course

FIRST AID COURSE WEDNESDAY 6th NOVEMBER. Cost £5 PER PERSON. Following the success of the CPR session run earlier in the year there will be a First Aid Course at a subsidised price. This follows a kind donation by village residents. The trainer has been booked so we will be confirming places and taking payment over the next few weeks.

The course will cover various First aid situations along with how to deal with a casualty using what you have around you. Events such as strokes, collapse, choking, shock, heart attacks, bleeds and diabetes will be included. Where the treatment differs for a minor this will also be covered.
