Local governance

Then we have two short surveys (both around 5-10 minutes to complete) on the future of local governance in our area. At present we have some services provided by the Lancaster City Council (e.g. local planning, housing, bin collections, local highways etc.) and others (e.g. highways and social care etc.) by Lancashire County Council. The government has proposed that we will need to form Unitary Authorities to bring all services under one authority with a population ideally of 500,000 people in each.

Yealand School News

I have had the pleasure of working at Yealand for a long time and the generosity and support from our local community has always been felt within school and something that we appreciate greatly.

Since becoming the headteacher, I have had the pleasure of working with the Village Hall committee and the Parish Council to affirm our place within the community and to make an impact on change which will support our young people.

We have always been a school which loves to be outside and when we were gifted a piece of land to set up as a forest school site some years ago, those who were involved with this probably have no idea what the weekly impact this has been on the lives of so many. They don't see or hear the weekly excitement as the children put on their wellies with plans for pirate ship play, den building and cooking on the fire or hear the excitement as they want to

share all about their adventures on their return.

Unfortunately, last year we had to approach two drivers who were driving recklessly past our children as they walked up to the pathway at the bottom of Silverdale Road. This led to a discussion and a visit to the site with members of the Parish Council.







On our behalf, they approached local landowners who quickly agreed that school could use their land to access our forest site from our school gate. In the last few weeks, we have used the pathways, stiles and gates which have been added to the site so that our children can access it safely and we are beyond happy.

I wanted to use this village news edition to say a huge thank you to all who have been involved in this project and to invite you to come and walk our new path with us for an official opening and forest school session with our whole school on

22nd October.

We are seeing bumper crops of fruit as the season moves into Autumn, including damsons, apples, pears, crab apples and these wild hawthorn

berries. Blackberries ripened in August. All responding to the changing weather patterns. This week has seen sunny, though cooler days, with even a few butterflies about still. Out in the woods

around Yealand you might have heard a chiffchaff or two singing before they migrate south, along with the occasional tawny owl hooting during the day. And listen out for the thin repeated tseep of the treecreeper, and the fine high notes of the goldcrest.
